

Two students earn scholarships

The Lake Washington College Foundation has awarded 56 student scholarships, including two to Redmond residents, totaling more than \$38,000 for the 2008-09 college year.

The scholarships range in size from \$250 to \$2,000 and help Lake Washington Technical College (LWTC) students with tuition, fees, books and childcare.

More than 20 of the LWTC students receiving scholarships were honored by the Foundation during the recent Celebrate Your Success ceremony at the college. The annual event recognizes students who have

earned the respect and admiration of both staff and fellow students through their hard work and determination to succeed.

Students recognized at this event included two Redmond residents:
